Lastly, note on the back of this newsletter the dates and new location for the OACES winter meeting and supervision summit. I look forward to an exciting and productive year.

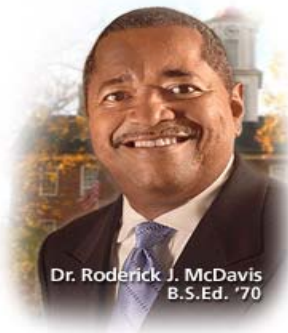

Counselor Educator Named 20th President of Ohio University

Roderick J. McDavis became Ohio University's 20th president on July 1, 2004. A native of Dayton, Ohio, he received a bachelor's degree in social sciences in secondary education from Ohio University in 1970, making him only the second university alumnus to lead the university as president. He received a master's degree in student personnel administration from the University of Dayton in 1971, and a doctorate in counselor education and higher education administration from the University of Toledo in 1974. McDavis served as dean of the College of Education and professor of education at the University of Florida from 1994-1999. He was dean of the College of Education and professor of counselor education at the University of Arkansas, Fayetteville, from 1989-1994. He served as the director of the Arkansas Academy for Leadership Training and School-Based Management from 1992-1994. He was a professor of education in the Department of Counselor Education at the University of Florida from 1974-1989 and an associate dean of the graduate school and minority programs at the University of Florida from



1984-1989.

President McDavis has a rich history in the field of counseling and counselor education. He is a co-author, along with Sue and Arredondo, of the seminal article in the area of multicultural counseling, Sue, D. Arredondo, P. & McDavis, R., (1992) Multicultural counseling competencies and standards: A call to the profession. *Journal of Counseling and Development*, 70, 477-486. This groundbreaking work is the cornerstone for multicultural practice within the counseling profession today.

McDavis has served as chair of the Board of Directors of the American Association of Colleges

for Teacher Education (AACTE). His primary interests and publications include restructuring teacher education programs, improving public schools and districts, counseling ethnic minorities, recruiting and retaining minority students and faculty, and evaluating student personnel programs. He has authored or co-authored book chapters, monographs and articles in professional journals and other publications.

McDavis has served as a consultant and keynote speaker for universities, community colleges, public school systems, human service agencies, professional associations, community organizations and churches. In 1995, McDavis was named Person of the Year in Education by *The Gainesville Sun*. He was named the 1996 Outstanding Alumnus of the College of Education at Ohio University. He also received the Post-Secondary Outstanding Educator Award from the North Central Florida Chapter of Phi Delta Kappa in 1996. McDavis received the 1997 Black Achiever's Award in Education from the Florida Conference of Black State Legislators.

ter's and doctoral degrees from the University of Virginia.

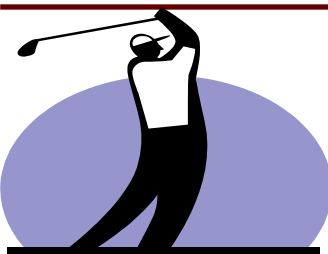
Her clinical experience has been in the area of eating disorders and body image, college counseling and community counseling. Her primary research

and teaching interests include counselor development, gender and cultural issues, eating disorders, and ethics.

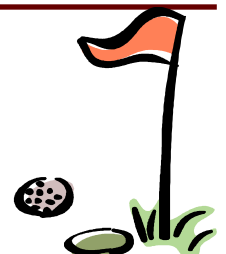

Possible Restructure of the 2005 Upcoming Supervision Summit

The OACES executive committee was considering restructuring the 2005 Supervision Summit. Based on conversations with other professionals, we propose three sessions be conducted at the same time. These three sessions will include the following:

- Basic / Intermediate Supervision Issues
- Advanced Supervision Issues
- Counselor Education Issues

The reason for separate sessions is that some have found the presentations to be too basic and do not provide advanced skills in supervision. Therefore, both basic and advanced content sessions will be offered. Also, for counselor

educators that may have already earned their CEU's in the area of supervision and ethics, providing content in counselor education may make attendance at the OACES Supervision Summit more attractive.

The location of the winter meeting and the Supervision Summit has been changed this year to the Concourse Hotel by the Columbus International Airport. This facility has offered us a better rate than the previous site which may spare us the revenue losses incurred at previous conferences.

We will discuss this issue at future meetings. It is our intention to lower individual costs and increase attendance at the Supervi-

sion Summit while also providing an outstanding CEU opportunity.

Remember, the OACES winter meeting is February 11, 2005 and the Supervision Summit is April 29, 2005. These meetings will be at the Concourse Hotel in Columbus. See you there!
